Opening of -

Sir,

I am directed to refer to your letter No. KDCA/152/79,  
dated 18/7/79 on the subject mentioned above and to state that Government has  
granted permission to you to open diploma course with an intake capacity of 30  
seats from 1980-81 on the following conditions :-

- (i) Your institute must make all preliminary arrangements by purchasing equipment and machinery for the course. The amount will be reimbursed by Government as per normal rules as the funds may permit.
- (ii) Your institute must have necessary laboratories of its own duly equipped.
- (iii) Your institute must have necessary staff qualified to teach diploma courses in Pharmacy and their scales of pay should not, in any case, be lower than those sanctioned by the State Government;
- (iv) Your institute must have necessary building and such other facilities for the use of staff and students.

2. You are now requested to take preliminary steps on the lines mentioned above and to report to the Director of Technical Education, within a period of 3 months whether you have necessary physical facilities and financial backing to undertake the courses.
